

## **Potomac Nationals Support Fans with New Video Technology**

The Potomac Nationals have installed a new video technology in-time for the Carolina League Playoffs at Prince William County's George R. Pfitzner Stadium which will switch live action and fan events to the stadium's Jumbotron. "This technology greatly increases our ability to enhance the fan experience at the park and provide live video and replays," said Jonathon Griffith, Potomac Nationals general manager.

The new technology is called Seastar from Mamigo Incorporated and it combines multiple megapixel video cameras into a panorama so the operator can see the expanse of the field in super- high resolution video. The operator can then select High Definition cut-outs of the panorama and stream that video to the Jumbotron. A single operator manages multiple viewpoints from around the field and broadcasts those without the need for camera operators or a production operation.

Chris Lautz, Mamigo vice president, said the Seastar technology was designed to provide a system to small to medium venues where broadcast cameras and large staffs to run a video head-end is not cost effective. With our system, using off-the-shelf equipment and small footprint, the smaller venues can have "big stadium features."

"We are happy to partner with the Potomac Nationals to introduce this technology to the market-place and they have a first-class venue with solid fan support. In the end, its all about supporting the venue and the fans," said Lautz.
